



Patrice Spath, MA, RHIT, is a health information management professional based in Forest Grove, Oregon. She has broad experience in health care quality and patient safety improvement. During the past 25+ years, she has presented over 300 educational programs on these topics at conferences hosted by groups such as the Maryland Patient Safety Center, the Connecticut Hospital Association, the Massachusetts Board of Registration in Medicine, the Tennessee Center for Patient Safety, the Oregon Medical Association, the North Carolina Center for Hospital Quality and Patient Safety, the Veterans Health Administration, and the American College of Healthcare Executives.

Patrice has authored several books including *Fundamentals of Healthcare Quality Management 5th ed.* (Brown-Spath & Associates, 2019), *Introduction to Healthcare Quality Management, 3rd ed.* (Health Administration Press, 2018), *Applying Quality Management in Healthcare: A Systems Approach* (Health Administration Press, 2017), *Strategic Management of Health Care Organizations* (Bridgepoint Education, 2014), and *Error Reduction in Health Care, 3rd ed.* (Jossey-Bass, 2011).

Patrice is active in the Oregon Health Information Management Association and has in the past served as President, member of the Board and in various other volunteer positions. She is an active member of the American Health Information Management Association (AHIMA) and has served on the Nominating Committee, co-chair of the Practice Council on Data Governance and Analytics, member of the Council on Certification and Council on Accreditation and various other volunteer positions.

From 2002 to 2014 she was on the advisory panel for WebM&M (<https://psnet.ahrq.gov/webmm>), an online case-based journal and forum on patient safety and healthcare quality supported by contract from the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ).

She has been the Treasurer of the National Association for Healthcare Quality and a member/chairman of their Certification Board, last serving on the Certification Study Guide task force in 1998. In 1997 Patrice was a member of the clinical path task group of the Association of Perioperative Registered Nurses (AORN) and in 2002 she served on a task group charged with updating the AORN quality management practice standards. In 1992-93 she was a member of an AHRQ- sponsored workgroup charged with developing methods for deriving medical review criteria, standards of quality and performance measures from clinical practice guidelines. From 1993 to 1995 she served as a regional councilor for the Health Care Division of the American Society for Quality Control and from 1988 to 1992 she was a member of the Fundamentals of Tumor Registry Operation Revision Task Group sponsored by the American College of Surgeons' Commission on Cancer

Patrice is an adjunct assistant professor in the Department of Health Services Administration at the University of Alabama, Birmingham where she currently teaches graduate level patient safety courses. She has also taught quality management and patient safety courses in the health information management (HIM) program at Missouri Western State University, the post-graduate HIM certificate program at Oregon Health and Sciences University, the healthcare simulation master's program at Drexel University College of Medicine, and the health administration undergraduate and master's program at Pacific University in Forest Grove, OR.
